

Has your DGPS put you in an unlawful position?

The 400 MHz band has changed!

Frequencies that used to be allocated to Differential GPS (DGPS) are now being used by government services like law enforcement and emergency services.

If you operate your DGPS equipment on these frequencies, you could disrupt or prevent these critical public safety services from doing their job.

Check now by asking:

- 1 Have all of your frequencies been authorised by a radiocommunications licence?
- 2 If you've bought or rented the frequencies pre-programmed and are using the supplier's licence, do you have their written authorisation?
- 3 Have you removed frequencies from your equipment that you aren't authorised to use?
- 4 If you're authorised, have you reviewed and understood the licence conditions and any 400 MHz band transition requirements?

Operating without a licence, or causing interference to other services, means you could be fined or taken to court.
